Captain Steve Sawyer, USCG (Ret.) Biography

Captain Sawyer retired from the U.S. Coast Guard in 2006 after 28 years of active duty service. He served as the Chief, Office of Search and Rescue from 2002 – 2006, where also: served as a U.S. delegate for three years to the International Maritime Organization's SAR/Communications sub-committee; served as an Executive Director to the International Maritime Rescue Federation (formerly International Lifeboat Federation); served as Acting Chairman to the National Search and Rescue Committee (NSARC); served as Chairman of the Mass Rescue Operations sub-committee to NSARC; and, delivered multiple papers at various national and international SAR conferences. His operational assignments in the Coast Guard included separate tours of duty at three Group Commands; serving as a Group Commander at Group Eastern Shore, Deputy Group Commander at Group Mayport, and as Group Operations Officer at Group Charleston. He was one of the first ten officers Servicewide to be awarded the Boat Force Operations insignia. Captain Sawyer joined AFRAS in 2006 as a member of the Board of Directors immediately after retirement from the Coast Guard, and became President in September, 2011. Captain Sawyer resides in northern Virginia with his wife Natalie.
